AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF  
SUPERIOR AMENDING SECTION 2-2-60 OF THE SUPERIOR  
MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS, Section 2-2-60 of the Superior Municipal Code governs the compensation for the Board of Trustees;

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees desires to increase the compensation for each Trustee from \$300 per month to \$500 per month; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees desires to increase the compensation for the Mayor from \$500 per month to \$750 per month.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR, COLORADO:

Section 1. Section 2-2-60 of the Superior Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

**Sec. 2-2-60. Compensation.**

(a) The compensation for each *member of the Board of Trustees other than the Mayor* shall be *five* ~~three~~ hundred dollars (*\$500.00*) (~~\$300.00~~) per month, payable on the last day of each month.

(b) The compensation for the ~~office of~~ Mayor shall be *seven* ~~five~~ hundred *fifty* dollars (*\$750.00*) (~~\$500.00~~) per month, payable on the last day of each month.

(c) The compensation paid to any member of the Board of Trustees shall not be increased or diminished for the term of office for which he or she has been elected or appointed. Any member of the Board of Trustees who has resigned or vacated an office prior to the end of his or her elective or appointed term shall not be eligible to serve in the same office during such term if the rate of compensation has been increased.

Section 2. Applicability. The changes made to Section 2-2-60 of the Superior Municipal Code shall not apply to any incumbent Trustee during his or her current term. The changes shall apply only to those Trustees elected to a new term at the November 2018 election or thereafter elected or appointed, and the new compensation shall commence at the start of the new

term.

Section 3.      Severability.      If any article, section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The Board of Trustees hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each part or parts hereof irrespective of the fact that any one or part or parts be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 4.      Safety.      This Ordinance is deemed necessary for the protection of the health, welfare and safety of the community.
