The Trust for Public Land, National Recreation and Park Association, and Urban Land Institute launched the 10-Minute Walk Campaign to celebrate and engage mayors and local leaders that promote a vision of expanding safe and equitable access to green spaces in cities nationwide.

Since October 2017, over **230 bipartisan mayors** from cities large and small have joined our coalition, in support of the goal that everyone in the U.S. should have a high-quality park within a 10-minute walk (or half-mile) of home.

Upon signing on, you'll have access to a **host of support and resources**, including free GIS and mapping tools to help target your investments, urban park policy and finance expertise, opportunities to apply for \$40,000 planning grants and cross-sector stakeholder panels that allow cities to inform, expand and activate their green spaces.

Joining the Campaign just requires supporting the vision that everyone deserves a high-quality park close to home. Our team will follow up to help you **set goals and develop plans to improve park access and quality in your city.**
